

**SECTION 2.02****RECREATIONAL AIRCRAFT PILOT LOG BOOK**

1. Pilots of recreational aircraft are required to keep an accurate record of their aeronautical experience. A Pilot's Log Book will be kept by all RA-Aus pilots and shall contain the following information, entered by the pilot:
  - a. date of flight;
  - b. duration of flight;
  - c. if under instruction, state dual or solo and the nature of the in-flight exercise carried out, and the name of the Pilot in Command;
  - d. type of aeroplane flown; and
  - e. registration markings of the aircraft.
2. Instructors are required to make appropriate entries into the logbooks of students and pilots detailing their competence after completion of:
  - a. a biennial flight review,
  - b. any in flight examination for the attainment of a rating or endorsement.

**NOTE:** CFIs must also make an appropriate entry into a student logbook for the attainment of a Flight Crew Certificate.

3. To ensure adequate information is supplied, instructors, CFIs, PEs shall:
  - a. ensure that the entry is signed and their name printed also.
  - b. ensure that the entry is properly dated.
  - c. ensure that the examining person also quotes their member number.

**NOTE:** Logbook entries are considered a legal document and as such require the utmost attention to detail during the entry.
